Attendant Outreach Services

Adults receiving this service are able to live in their own apartment or home and services are offered on a regularly-scheduled basis, seven days a week, 6 a.m. to 12 Midnight, subject to available funding. This service may be in addition to other services being received from other home visitation agencies. Those not receiving services from other agencies are still able to apply for, and receive, KPP support services.



Donations & Volunteers

Kawartha Participation Projects is a charitable organization and donations are used to assist those we support, for items that are not funded, such as equipment, assistance devices, leisure activities, and other life experiences.

Volunteers are needed to spend recreation or leisure time with many individuals and/or to become involved in various KPP committees. Who can Apply?

Support services are offered to adults:

- who have a physical disability
- who are frail, elderly and/or cognitively impaired
- living with HIV/AIDS
- living with an acquired brain injury
- who require help with activities of daily living
- who require the availability of 24-hour, on-site or on call assistance (Supportive Housing only)

Applicants may apply themselves, through family or be referred from institutions or other organizations.

Applicants to the Attendant Outreach Service must reside, or intend to reside, in the counties where support services are offered by KPP to access this service.

How to Apply?

Application forms can be picked up at the Main Office, Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. These forms can also be mailed, emailed or provided in an alternative format to meet your needs.

Once all forms are completed and returned in whole, including the medical which must be completed by one's doctor, then the applicant will be contacted in regard to service needs.

Our Story

Many years ago we identified a marked lack of adequate facilities for the disabled, and thus Kawartha Participation Projects (a.k.a. K.P.P) was formed in 1978. Simply, we endeavour to provide accessible housing and support services to people with physical disabilities.

Since 1983 KPP has successfully established supportive housing units for individuals with physical disabilities in various apartment complexes. KPP's central operation is located at **Towerhill Village, 77 Towerhill Road, Peterborough.** Towerhill Village is a seventy one unit apartment and town house integrated community. Eighteen units are modified for wheelchair accessibility. KPP also provides supportive housing at various locations throughout Peterborough and The City of Kawartha Lakes with the availability of some rent geared to income units.

In 1999, Kawartha Participation Projects Foundation was incorporated as a non-profit organization dedicated to raising funds to assist people with physical disabilities in the four counties of Haliburton, Northumberland, Peterborough and The City of Kawartha Lakes.

Description of Services Offered

Support services offered include but *are not limited to* the following:

- personal grooming and hygiene
- bathing and washing
- bowel routines, catheterization
- meal preparation and eating assistance
- assistance with rising and retiring
- assistance with breathing
- positioning and transferring
- housekeeping
- shopping, banking, paying bills
- essential communication
- assistance with pre-measured medication
- assistance with exercises
- other homemaking tasks
- changing dressings
- physical assistance with the care of children

Location of Housing Units

Auburn Village, Peterborough

4 Independent, 1 bedroom apartments with 24-hour on-call/support plus booked services.

Myrtle Terrace, Peterborough

12 Independent apartments with 24-hour in-house/on-location support services.

St. Giles, Peterborough

3 Independent, 1 bedroom apartments with 24-hour on-call/support plus booked services.

St. John's Centre, Peterborough

10 Independent, 1 bedroom apartments with 24-hour in-house/on-location support services.

St. Peter's, Peterborough

30 Accessible units, ranging from bachelor to 1 & 2 bedroom apartments with 24-hour in-house/on-location support services.

Towerhill Village, Peterborough

18 Accessible units, 1 & 2 bedroom apartments plus 2, 3 & 4 bedroom townhouses with 24-hour in-house/on-location support services to eligible persons.

Supportive Housing, City of Kawartha Lakes

24-Hour on-call support plus booked services at various locations. 24 hour on-site support services to eligible persons.

Partnerships with private landlords exist throughout the 4 counties.
